The United Parcel Service in West Sacramento now hosts the company's largest fleet of natural gas vehicles in California. This year, UPS deployed 21 new green vehicles to West Sacramento, bringing the total to 130. The \$65,000 trucks are expected to yield a 20 percent reduction in emissions. The facility also has its own natural gas pumping station, which is open to the public.

Bumgarner, 2005, Cabernet Sauvignon, Duarte-Georgetown Vineyard, El Dorado, \$48: Cabernet Sauvignon is one of California's most prized varietals. The majority of these highly rated wines come from Napa's mountain districts, which provide higher elevations yielding greater solar radiance, steeper vineyards with great drainage and red volcanic soils. The El Dorado terroir has many of these classic conditions. This wine offers a perfect combination of intense flavors, dark cherry, cedar, French oak, integrated tannins and terrific complexity.
